Five-Basic-Sentence-Patterns—(Sentence-Construction)

A sentence has two basic elements: the subject and the predicate. The subject is always a noun, a pronoun, or a group of words acting as a noun. It is what the whole sentence is about. Meanwhile, the predicate contains a verb that describes the subject. Take note, verbs do not always have to be action verbs.

Expanding Sentences The examples above are basic sentences. Basic sentences can be expanded, or lengthened, by adding adjectives, adverbs and objects. 1. Subject-Verb. Jack eats. This is the basic subject-verb pattern. Jack quickly eats. An adverb is added (quickly) to tell how Jack eats. Jack quickly eats carrots.

The Basic Simple Sentence Pattern. In this pattern, the subject is always the first structural element and the predicator immediately comes after it. That is, we have the Subject-Predicator (S-P) structure. Any sentence that does not follow this pattern is simply a non-basic sentence.

Grammar patterns are ways of describing how words are used in English. A grammar pattern tells us what phrases or clauses are used with a given adjective, noun, or verb. For example the adjective afraid can be used with a that-clause (He was afraid that...) or a prepositional phrase with of (She is afraid of...).

Subject + verb. The simplest of sentence patterns is composed of a subject and verb without a direct object or subject complement. It uses an intransitive verb, that is, a verb requiring no direct object: Control rods remain inside the fuel assembly of the reactor.
