Third grade students who did not pass the reading portion of the assessment were retained in the third grade. The limitation of one administration of the reading TAKS test as of the Spring of 2009 is that it does not allow for feedback toward progress in passing the reading portion of the test. Specifically, the elimination of these prior test opportunities means that educators no longer have access to a Confidential Student Report of student performance. This report provided formative information to use in modifying instruction for students. Districts have turned to the use of other reading tests to determine student progress in years prior to TAKS testing.
